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To Marquette University faculty, staff, and students:

The Academic Integrity Council realizes that, with the release in late 2022 of ChatGPT-3 and then other large language model-based chatbots (usually referred to as “generative artificial intelligence”), there is a need for clarity on the use of these technologies in our university community.

The Academic Integrity Office and the Center for Teaching and Learning have partnered to create a guiding statement and instructor resources for syllabi to promote a shared understanding of acceptable and unacceptable use of large language model-based chatbots in coursework at Marquette University.

We will look to reexamine the status and use of such technologies as these develop in higher education and in wider society, adjusting these materials accordingly as needed.
